How high should you mount paper dispensers?

Reach limits for soap and hand towel dispensers do not differ in locations for instance, bathrooms, kitchens and pantry. Recommended height to install a dispenser is **between 1300-1520mm above the floor**.

Following <u>NEA regulations</u> for amenities to be provided in public toilet, paper towel dispenser shall be provided for every two count of wash hand basins, subject to a minimum of one. Paper towel dispensers shall be positioned directly above and at least between every two wash hand basins.







How high should you mount JRT dispensers?

From side view, mount within 180-220mm in front of toilet from centerline and 760-890mm above the floor.



Following <u>BCA Regulations</u>, from top view, mount within 350-400mm from **centerline of toilet bowl to cubicle wall.**







How high should you mount JRT dispensers in ambulant disabled toilets?

Following <u>BCA Regulations</u>, jumbo toilet roll dispenser is allowed provided it is reachable & does not interfere with the use of grab bars.

- 150 mm ≤ Ht ≤ 200 mm above the horizontal grab bar
- Approximately 50 mm from the front edge of the seat to the centerline of the toilet roll dispenser







Step 1:

Measure the desired height of the dispenser from the floor





Step 2: Mark your hanging points using a marker or pencil







Drill into the hanging points using the electric drill







4: Use a hammer to tap the wall anchors into the wall
